

IT'S BIRTH

The birth of the Nation of Israel (the Jewish people) took place approximately 4000 years ago, when, the Lord called 'one' man by the name of Abram, in union with his wife, Sarai.

Their son of promise was born, whose given name was Isaac, and from Isaac and his wife Rebekah, Jacob was born. The birthright episode always reminds us that the Lord God from eternity through this present day, weaves the pattern of History and it's events to bring to pass His good pleasure, thus, Jacob became the father of the twelve tribes of Israel.

Four generations passed, in order for God's plan to develop in reference to His holy, chosen and special people, as they began to grow into a Nation that would represent Him, in spirit and in truth before the whole world.

Prior to this, the Lord had informed Abram that his seed would become strangers in a land that is not theirs, and that they would serve their captors for four hundred years, afterwards they would come out with great substance. The Almighty God also

said that He would judge this Nation that they served. We know that these judgments came in the form of ten plagues upon the whole Land of Egypt.
